

International Travel

Fewer inbound passengers, strong outbound

US inbound and outbound air travel (Jan-Jun YTD)

International passenger flows, in millions



- Outbound U.S. travel up 23% vs. 2019, while inbound lags 13% below prepandemic
- Forward bookings down
 18% YoY, signaling no quick international rebound

 Overseas arrivals down 1.2% YTD; June fell 3.4%, draining high-spend international guests





- Reinstates Business Interest Deductibility
- Creates Opportunity Zones Permanency
- No Tax on Tips and Overtime to Help Frontline
 Workers


Not included: Backdoor tax increases like changes to business state and local tax deduction, distortions to individual and family marginal rates, retaliatory taxes/Section 899, changes to carried interest treatment.

Tariffs Impacting Operating Costs


Placed into effect since January 1, 2025

Mexico: 25% on most goods



Canada: 35% on most goods

China: 20% on all goods, 125% tariff paused



Trade deficit-reducing tariffs: 10-41% (varies by country)



De minimis exemption: Eliminated



Steel and aluminum:

50% globally



Medium- and heavyduty trucks:

25%





New Timber, Lumber and Derivative Product Tariffs

Timber, Lumber, and Derivative Product Tariffs Announced via Proclamation September 29, 2025



The White House proclamation announcing these new tariffs left the door open for both:

- Trade negotiations to lower tariffs and
- Expanding the set of impacted products through an inclusionary process.

Note: The Section 232 authorities underlying these tariffs are **separate** from the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) authorities that will be the subject of U.S. Supreme Court arguments in November.






Government Shutdown



- \$31m per day cost for lodging
- \$1b per week cost for trave
- 13k air traffic controllers and 50,000 TSA agents without pay
- AHLA is joining other industries in calling for a speedy end to the shutdown.


